BISHOP STRICKLAND ON OUR DUTIES POST-ELECTION

Bishop Joseph Strickland, the Bishop Emeritus of Tyler, Texas has cautioned Catholic Americans after the Republican victories in the 2024 elections, calling on people to 'stand strong in the truth' and oppose 'false messages', wherever they come from.

"It is not a time to sit back and say, 'O we won...We pray that we have an opportunity to fight back the darkness and the evil, and the false messages that are infecting even the Church. We've got to seize this moment, (we cannot) sit back and allow and just say, 'Oh well, this person in authority said this, so it must be true.'

Instead, people must 'know Jesus Christ well enough to say, No, I don't care what authority is saying, it's not the truth. We need to know the truth: that is Jesus Christ.

The Bishop encouraged people to pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament and to the Blessed Virgin Mary in order to have the strength to defend the truth.

"I urge all of us to pray before Him in His presence in the Blessed Sacrament. That is the strength that I need, that we all need to proclaim to the world Who our Savior is. Since we have a King, we have a Queen of Heaven, the Blessed Virgin Mary."

"We need to get strong. We need to be clear. We need to speak up and not allow anyone in office or in the pulpit say something that isn't true to Christ and let it go."

"We need to stop compromising and letting it go, particularly emphasizing the immorality of abortion and other threats to life and to the family."

Standing for the truth does not mean in any way attacking anyone, said the Bishop. "But we need to stand strong in the truth and joyfully and clearly proclaim what that truth is, because too many are deluded."
