PRIESTS' MEETING WITH OUR BISHOP

This past Tuesday, the pastors of our Vicariate (Rome, Oneida, Verona, Canastota, Sherrill, Vernon, Hamilton, Camden, Boonville, Forestport, Taberg, Lee Center, and Holland Patent) met with Bishop Lucia over the present critical situation in the Diocese with priest personnel. The Bishop began the meeting telling us that right now, he has no one he can call to cover an emergency should a priest get ill or have an accident. The Bishop himself is covering two parishes, rather large ones at that. Bishop Lucia pointed out that changes have to be made, not down the road, but in the near future. He then went on to specify what changes he had in mind, although he did not give us liberty to announce them as yet. He went around the table, where there were 10 priests present. Of those, five of us are in our 70's, and thus eligible to retire (one priest is 81 and still a pastor!!!).

The astonishing, amazing and wondrous thing was, again, Our Lady of Good Counsel was completely passed over in any of the projections! How pleased must Our Lady be with our "Memorare" to her after Mass!

SACRAMENTAL STATISTICS FOR 2023

Each year we present you the data for the previous year's administration of the Sacraments in our parish. They are one way of measuring the life of the parish, which is of course, a spiritual reality that defies quantifying. However, these are some observable indicators we have of gauging the parish's vitality. These figures are reported annually to the Diocese, and are used by the officials to determine the sustainability of the parish.

Baptisms: 13 (One of which was of an adult, on his deathbed).

Marriages: 2 (Both were between two Catholics).

First Holy Communions: 11

Confirmations: 9 (One of which was of an adult, on his deathbed).

Deaths: 6

Currently, we have 12 people confined to their homes or living in health care facilities, whom the Pastor visits regularly with the Blessed Sacrament. The women of our Rosary Society and our Sodality girls visit them during the holy seasons of the year to let them know that they are not forgotten by their parish. They also receive a parish bulletin weekly by mail to keep them "in the loop" as they say.

As we have reported to you in the past, the statistics diocesan-wide are disastrous, as is the case with most of the dioceses in the northeast, anyway. The numbers of Baptisms, Weddings, Confirmations and First Communions have plummeted over the past 10 years or so. A classmate of mine, pastor of a parish larger than ours in our diocese, recently told me that he has not had a wedding in three years in his parish.
