THE ELECTION DILEMMA

Pro-life voters and faithful Catholics have been troubled by Donald Trump's compromises on the question of abortion. He now favors the baby-killing in specific circumstances, is in favor of the In Vitro Fertilization procedure, which kills many human embryos with each attempt at conception, and is not opposed to the abortion pill, which is the cause now, of about 60% of the abortions committed in the United States.

The Bishops of the United States remind Catholics that abortion is the number one issue in the election: that no faithful Catholic may vote for someone who favors the killing of unborn innocent human life.

So what are we, who wish to be faithful Catholics to do? Certainly, no conscientious Catholic may vote for Kamala Harris, who advocates and champions abortion. She wants no limits on abortion, even up to the moment of birth. As a US Senator, she co-sponsored the Women's Health Protection Act, which would eliminate pro-life state laws across the country. She voted against protection for unborn babies when they can feel pain, and against the protection of babies who survive a "botched" abortion. Her Vice-presidential running mate, Tim Walz, signed the "Protect Reproductive Options Act as Governor of Minnesota, which prohibits local governments from passing ordinances against abortion. He also signed into law the "safe haven for abortionists" bill which allows abortionists accused or convicted in other states to hide in Minnesota.

But can we vote for Trump, given his new-found stance on abortion? Bishop Athanasius Schneider says "no", we may not now that Trump is pro-abortion. However, some moral theologians apply what is called the "lesser of two evils" position. Both Harris and Trump favor abortion, at least in some cases. However, under a Trump presidency, there may be more restrictions on the procedure:

He speaks out against late-term abortions.

He would allow individual states to be a pro-life as their people, legislatures and governors want to be. He will not attempt to nullify those current 20 state laws which are more restrictive of abortion, or prevent other states from enacting such laws.

Trump will not use the federal government to harass those who disagree with him.

Trump's nominees for federal judges and/or the Supreme Court will be far more preferable than Harris'

He will respect the conscience rights of individuals and organizations.

Between now and the election, you must prayerfully decide whom you will vote for.
