"FAST" from using your phone as a source of entertainment, or diversion. Use it only for necessary communications. Limit your phone time to a specific amount of time, and do not use the phone outside those times.

RESTRICT your TV watching: instead of passing whole evenings in front of the screen, devote ½ hour to reading Sacred Scripture.

RECENT CATHOLIC STATISTICS (Seminarians Decreased Each Year Since Pope Francis' Election)

The Catholic population of the world continued to grow by more than 1% and has now exceeded 1.4 billion. This is according to the latest data published in the Pontifical Yearbook (2025). The figures are for the year 2023.

It shows rapid growth of the Catholic population in Africa, with slower growth in the Americas and Asia, and almost no growth in Europe.

Africa, with a Catholic population growth rate of 3.3% in 2023, now accounts for 20% of the world's Catholics-almost as many as Europe, which is 20.4% Catholic. But with Europe's Catholic population growing by only 0.2%, Africa is likely to soon overtake Europe.

North and South America have the largest Catholic population, accounting for nearly half (47.8%) of the world's total. The growth rate was 0.9% there.

In Asia, the Catholic population grew by 0.6% and in Oceania by 1.9%. There were 406,996 priests in the world at the end of 2023: a decrease of 0.2% from the previous year. This trend is likely to continue, as the number of seminarians (106,495) also decreased by 1.8%.

There was an increase of 2.7% of the number of priests in Africa and a decrease of 1.6% in Europe.

The total number of seminarians worldwide decreased from 108,481 in 2022 to 106,495 in 2023. The number of seminarians has decreased every year since 2012. (Pope Francis became Pope in 2013).

The number of women religious (sisters) also decreased by 1.6% continuing a long-term trend.

In the United States, the number of converts to the Catholic Church in 1999 was 172,581. By 2022, the number had dropped to 72,212, a decline of 58%. A recently published Pew Study Survey reveals that for every one convert to the Church today in the United States, eight Catholics leave the Church.
