SOME GUIDANCE ON CHARITIES

The Lepanto Institute is a watchdog organization which monitors various "Catholic" charities and other organizations for supporting activities that do not conform to Catholic moral teaching. It has published dozens of reports on the contraceptive-pushing activities of Catholic Relief Services, and the Marxist, pro-abortion, pro-LGBT organizations receiving funding from the Campaign for Human Development, an operation of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Institute has a listing of those organizations which are considered "safe" to support for a believing, faithful Catholic, and those which are "not safe" to support, given our moral teachings. You can look up an organization which you may be supporting, or wish to contribute to, to see whether or not they "pass the test" of being in compliance with Catholic moral teaching. Just go to lepanto.org and click on the Charity Reports button, and find the organization you wish to find out about.

Many people will be surprised to find that one of the most popular charities, the St Jude Childrens' Hospital, is on the "not safe" list. Despite the name, the hospital is not affiliated with the Catholic Church in any way. It was founded by the devoutly Catholic entertainer, Danny Thomas. He wanted the hospital named for his favorite Saint, Saint Jude. But the hospital, which does undoubtedly good work in caring for children with serious illness or accidents without charge, is also involved in supporting "the gay agenda": sponsoring and marching in Gay Pride parades, fighting to enforce employers to hire people who identify as homosexual or transgendered. The Institute also found the Hospital promoting the use of contraceptives. You can read the full reports on this and many other organizations on the above-named website.

The Institute's director, Michael Hichborn, writes about a report he submitted to an African Bishop on the involvement of Catholic Relief Services with a project in the Congo. They had found inventory reports showing CRS being responsible for the reception and distribution of abortifacient contraception. After discussing the report with the Bishop, the Bishop said, pointing to a tree outside his window:

"Here in Africa, you can see many trees like this with marvelous and intricate designs on the trunk. You would think these designs were made by masterful craftsmen, but if you push on the tree, it will fall over because it was destroyed on the inside by termites. And these termites, which are so white that they are almost clear, and which are so destructive, turn to jelly in the sunlight.....You must expose these termites to the Light!"
