A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP STRICKLAND

His Excellency, Bishop Joseph Strickland, Bishop-Emeritus of Tyler, TX has issued another Message to the faithful as we enter the month of June, the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I have listened to his audio message, but am not finding a print version, so what I offer here is my own summary of the good Bishop's words.

The Bishop notes that as we enter the month devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we cannot help but be concerned and worried about the state of the world, and of the Church in particular. He states that the level of evil and corruption in the world is increasing at an alarming pace, and has now even affected the Church. (Aside: as if we need any examples, but for those who are still naive, I offer the following: For World Children's Week just a couple of weeks ago, the Vatican officially programmed a Drag Queen performance for the kiddies. Pope Francis has sent a letter to a man dismissed from the seminary for homosexual actions, telling him to "go ahead with your vocation.")

Bishop Strickland remarks that the Church has been so overwhelmed with evil, that she is now largely ineffective in combating it. As he says, "the ship has been taking on water for some time now, and is in danger of capsizing".

Using a vision of St. John Bosco, Bishop Strickland says that the two anchors that hold the Church together in times of crisis are the Most Blessed Sacrament and our Blessed Lady. He notes that in our time, these two anchors have been weakened and undermined in the Church by the scandals, the abuses and the indifference of so many. While they are not as strong and effective as they once were, they still are the two pillars through which the Church sails in times like these, times of great crisis.

And yet, we must remain confident that Our Lord is with us, and will not abandon us. The good Bishop repeatedly tells us that the Heart of Our Lord is beating with love for us. It began beating in the womb of Our Lady when He was just conceived, It stopped beating when It was stabbed by the spear of the centurion on Calvary, but now It beats again in the Risen Christ. Bishop Strickland encourages us to "be still" and listen for that Heartbeat. He says that if we listen for It, we will "hear" It pulsating with love for us. Our Lord said, "Fear not, I have overcome the world." We cannot give into a spirit of dejection and despair, for then, the evil one has truly won. We must place all our hope in Christ and the Mother of God, who has been preparing us and warning us for these times for many years now.
