## DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY INDULGENCE: SUN. 28 APRIL 2019

The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. On this Sunday, Holy Mother Church grants a Plenary Indulgence to the faithful who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, either exposed or in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the Merciful Lord Jesus Christ, (e.g. “Merciful Jesus, I trust in You”). If unable to get to the church, one may gain the indulgence if you recite the Our Father and the Creed before an image of the Divine Mercy, and reciting the devout invocation.

To gain a plenary indulgence, one must be in the state of grace at the time the indulgence is gained. One must receive the Sacrament of Penance within a week's time of the Divine Mercy Sunday, and one must receive the Blessed Eucharist on that Sunday. In addition, one must not have any attachment even to venial sin.
