Our Lady of Sorrows  
Feast: September 15

Who cannot help but recognize that we are in times of unparalleled crisis in the Church and in our nation? In times of such turmoil and evil, the Mother of God is invoked under her title as Mother of Sorrows, as she has shown herself to be so compassionate to the anguish of her children. This feast was established by Pope Pius VII in thanksgiving for the deliverance of the Church from the years when she was under the domination of secular authority, (1809-1814). In her apparitions in Rwanda in the 1980's, she asked us to pray frequently the Rosary of her Seven Sorrows.

Here are the Seven Dolours (Sorrows) of Our Lady:

1. The prophecy of Simeon in the Temple (St. Luke 2:34-35).
2. The Flight into Egypt (St. Matthew 2:13-14).
3. The loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (St. Luke 2:43-45).
4. Jesus and Mary meet on the Way of the Cross.
5. The Crucifixion and Death of Our Lord (St. John 19:16-30).
6. Our Lord is taken down from the Cross
7. The Body of Our Lord is placed in the tomb (St. Mt. 26:59-60)

“Our Lady's co-operation in the redemption of the world gives us a fresh view of her magnificence. Neither the Immaculate Conception nor the Assumption will give us a higher idea of Mary's exaltation than the title of co-redemptress. Her dolours were not necessary for the redemption of the world, but in the counsels of God, they were

inseparable from it. They belong to the integrity of the divine plan.

Are not Mary's mysteries Jesus' mysteries, and His mysteries hers?

The truth appears to be, that all the mysteries of Jesus and Mary were in God's design, one mystery. Jesus Himself was Mary's sorrow, seven times repeated, aggravated sevenfold.”
