You Cannot Make this Stuff Up

Last weekend, at a political rally held in the Piazza in front of the Cathedral of Milan, the Minister of the Interior of Italy, Matteo Salvini, commended his country, its citizens, and himself to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He appealed to the Patron Saints of Europe: St. Benedict of Norcia, St. Brigid of Sweden, Sts. Cyril and Methodius, St. Catherine of Siena, and St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Salvini then kissed his rosary, looked up to the statue of the Madonna atop the Cathedral, and said, "I entrust Italy, my life and your lives to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, who I'm sure will bring us the victory." Nice, eh? Wouldn't you love to hear an American politician be so devout and faithful?

Salvini, head of Italy's La Lega (The League) Party, led the rally with 10 other populist leaders ahead of this week's European Parliament elections, in a growing resistance to centralized European Union control, and in particular, for tightening immigration laws. For this, he has been labeled a "nationalist" by the media and the left.

But such displays of Catholic faith and piety are not receiving a welcome response from the quarters from which you think they would: the Vatican and the hierarchy of the Church in Italy, surprise, surprise.

Fr. Antonio Spadaro SJ, editor of *La Civilta Cattolica*, and close confidant of Pope Francis, issued several tweets criticizing Salvini and saying that Christians should be outraged. He also opposed a

proposed law last year in Italy which would require crucifixes be placed in all public buildings.

Vatican Secretary of State Pietro Cardinal Parolin issued an apparent rebuke to Salvini last Sunday saying, "I believe partisan politics divides, but God belongs to everyone. Invoking God for oneself is always very dangerous." (That's news to me!)

Angelo Cardinal Bagnasco, President of the European Bishops Conference, also denounced Salvini to the press, saying that particular groups cannot appropriate Christian values and that "acceptance and integration" are essential values of the Gospel.

Another Italian Bishop even said that Salvini can no longer call himself a Christian! "We can no longer allow people to appropriate the sacred signs of our faith to peddle their inhuman, anti-historic views, diametrically opposed to the Gospel message."

What's behind their fury? Salvini is calling for limitation of Moslem immigration into Europe, which is one of the only sins in the liberal catechism.

And on and on they bloviated...causing one to wonder, whose side are you on anyway? Oh, I forgot...we already know the answer to that one.
