PLENARY INDULGENCES AVAILABLE THIS WEEK:

On Tue. 31 Dec., a Plenary Indulgence may be gained by reciting the Te Deum which is on page 1060 of the Missal in the pews. This is the "official" prayer of Thanksgiving of the Church. We recite it on this day to thank God for His blessings, graces and mercies throughout the past year.

On Wed. 1 Jan., a Plenary Indulgence may be gained by reciting the Veni Creator Spiritus, to implore the Holy Spirit for His graces on the new year. It is found on page 1029 of the Missal in the pews. Conditions for gaining a Plenary Indulgence: One must receive Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is granted; one must receive the Sacrament of Penance within 8 days before/after gaining the Indulgence, and one must pray for the intentions of the Pope, and not have an attachment even to venial sin.

The "Te Deum"

This hymn is the Church's traditional act of thanksgiving. If it is recited on the last day of the year, 31 Dec., one may gain a Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions.

We praise You, O God: we acknowledge You to be the Lord. All the earth worships You, the Father everlasting. To You all the angels cry aloud, the Heavens and all the powers therein: To You the Cherubim and the Seraphim continually do cry: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts. Heaven and earth are full of the majesty of Your glory. The glorious choir of the Apostles praise You. The white-robed army of martyrs praise You. The holy Church throughout the world acknowledges You. The Father of infinite majesty. The adorable, true and only Son. And the Holy Spirit the Comforter. You are the King of glory, O Christ. You are the everlasting Son of the Father. You, when You took human nature to deliver man, did not disdain the Virgin's womb. When you overcame the sting of death, You opened to believers the kingdom of heaven. You sit at the right hand of God, in the glory of the Father. We believe that You will come to be our Judge.

We beseech You, therefore, help Your servants, who You have redeemed with Your precious blood. Make them to be numbered among Your Saints, in glory everlasting.

O Lord, save Your people, and bless Your inheritance. Govern them and exalt them forever.

Day by day we bless You; and we praise Your name forever, yes, forever and ever.

Grant O Lord, this day to keep us without sin. Have mercy on us Lord, as we have hoped in You.

O Lord, in You have we hoped, let us not be confounded forever.
