**INDULGENCES FOR THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY**

In this month dedicated to the Souls of the Faithful Departed, Holy Mother Church grants the faithful the following indulgences which

may be gained for the departed souls. Please note that this year, due to the “pandemic”, the Sacred Penitentiary (office of the Holy See that regulates the Sacrament of Penance and Indulgences), has extended the time for gaining the Indulgences from the first eight days of November, to each of the 30 days of the month. Only eight plenary indulgences may be obtained, but on any of the 30 days of the month.

A plenary indulgence is granted to any of the faithful who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The usual conditions for gaining a Plenary Indulgence, given below, must be fulfilled.

A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who will visit a church on the Commemoration of All Souls (2 November) and who will recite the Creed and the Our Father.

To gain a plenary indulgence, one must be in the state of sanctifying grace. One must receive the Blessed Eucharist on the day of the pious work, and sacramental Penance (Confession) within 8 days prior or after performing the work.

One must also pray for the intentions of the Pope. (It is understood that the Pope's intention is always for the good of the Church).

One must not have an attachment to even venial sin.

If any of the above conditions are lacking, the indulgence will be partial.

A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to sin. A partial indulgence removes some of the temporal punishment due to sin.
