Continue to watch over all who are sick as well as those who care for them and give wisdom to all who are seeking a cure. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

(This prayer was sent out by the Diocese of Syracuse, with the request that we pray it for nine consecutive days for the cessation of the current occurrence. His Excellency, Bishop Lucia has also mandated the following measures:

-Anyone showing symptoms of the illness is not to come to church. He has granted a dispensation from the Mass obligation for those who are vulnerable, i.e. those who are elderly, or have health conditions which make them susceptible to infection.

-Remove holy water from the fonts, and keep them dry.

-Refrain from placing hands on children and others who are not receiving Holy Communion.

-To refrain from physical contact with priests in greeting them. Other directives do not directly involve the laity, and are not listed here. The Bishop also asks that anyone who receives a positive test result for COVID-19, or has been in direct contact with someone who has a confirmed case, to notify the Chancellor of the Diocese at 315 422 7203).
