#### ANNUAL CLERGY CONFERENCE REPORT

This past week, from Monday afternoon until Wednesday at noon, your Pastor attended the Annual Clergy Conference that was held in Alexandria Bay, N.Y., as it has been for many years. This year, Bishop Lucia asked that all priests attend the Conference, so I dutifully did so, not having attended one in many a year. Now that our Bishop has been in office for a little over a year, he wanted to give us his views on the diocese thus far. This year's Conference was devoted to the pressing theme of Vocations. The presenter was a woman from San Antonio, Texas, who has given workshops to many dioceses throughout the country. She was very enthusiastic, informative and sincere in her commitment to helping the Church face the drastic shortage of priests and religious that we are witnessing in our historical moment. Bishop Lucia announced that he is declaring a Year of Vocations to begin this November, under the patronage of St. Joseph. We will be hearing much more about this as this Year gets closer. We were asked to recruit a few volunteers from our parish to attend a Conference for the laity in Syracuse in November. Those who attend this workshop will be given some ideas and resources to bring back to the parish for the Year for Vocations. If you would like to be one of our parish representatives, please contact me. The Syracuse Vocations Summit, as it is being called, will be held on Sat. 14 November from 9AM until 3 PM at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse.

Bishop Lucia reviewed his first year in office, with all of the challenges that we are faced with: the extension of the time limit in which to submit a claim of sexual abuse (August 2021). He said that the Syracuse Diocese had received 200 complaints of sexual abuse since the period opened up. This, he noted, was far fewer than many of the NYS dioceses had received. He spoke of his decision to file for Chapter 11 Reorganization of the diocese, or bankruptcy. He did this, he said, because in justice we owe the victims of clerical sexual abuse some recompense for their suffering. Our parish paid a \$1,000 payment into the "Parish Protection Fund", which would put the parish out of reach of any future lawsuits, hopefully. Bishop Lucia also emphasized that we must be vigilant in observing all the restrictions that the Wuhan virus has imposed on us through the government health agencies. This means, wearing masks to Mass, observing the social distancing that is mandated, etc. I know you will understand and cooperate, despite our misgivings about the motivation for these measures. God bless you.
