ANOTHER HORRIBLE PIECE OF LEGISLATION

The National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), H R 4350/S4049 is an amendment to the Selective Service Act which would require young women to register for the draft. It makes no exceptions for married, pregnant or nursing mothers. It would open the door to women in combat. It considers the male-only Selective Service "discriminatory".

The Department of Defense lifted the ban on women in the military in 2013. In Dec. 2015, it opened all remaining occupations and positions to women, effective Jan. 2016. This bill has bipartisan support, and also the support of one Joseph Biden. Contact your Congressman & Senators.

FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH

This weekend another of the Church's Synods will be inaugurated by Pope Francis in the Vatican. A synod is an advisory council, and usually consists of Bishops selected from around the world, who gather to discuss a given topic relating to the life of the Church.

This Synod has for its theme, "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission". This Synod, however, will be different in that at the local level of each Diocese, there will be discussions about this theme, and then the consensus of the discussions will be collated and delivered to the Vatican, where a final document will be issued, usually in the form of an Apostolic Exhortation.

So next Sunday, 17 October, Bishop Lucia will be opening the local synodal deliberations with a Mass of the Holy Spirit at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse at 5:10 PM. He invites all parishioners of the Diocese to attend this Mass, imploring the Holy Spirit's assistance on the whole Synod. For those unable to attend, the Mass will be livestreamed on the diocesan YouTube channel.

This global synod will then be the basis for our own local diocesan synod, which will be concluded in 2024.

Bishop Lucia writes, "You may be wondering what this journeying together looks like? Well, it begins with listening to one another. Therefore, in all Catholic dioceses throughout the world between now and April, diocesan bishops are asked to convene listening sessions of the faithful to foster our reflecting together."

Quoting the Preparatory Document for the Synod, His Excellency runs through the purposes of the Synod:

- -recalling how the Holy Spirit calls us today to be witnesses to God's love, -living a "participative and inclusive" ecclesial process that offers everyone an opportunity to express themselves;
- -recognizing and appreciating the wealth and the variety of gifts and charisms that the "Spirit" liberally bestows for the good of the Church and mankind:
- -exploring participatory ways of exercising responsibility in the proclamation of the Gospel and in the effort to build a more beautiful and habitable world;
- -examining how responsibility and power are lived in the Church, as well as the structures by which they are managed;

And several other aims and purposes. Get ready...we are going to be hearing a lot about all this in the next few years.
