Next Sunday: Group II attends Holy Mass

As we announced last weekend, Bishop Lucia has revoked the dispensation that he had granted during the scamdemic, which excused the laity from assistance at Holy Mass. This was done in order to protect the faithful from the virus and from infecting others with it. Now that the virus has peaked, Catholics of the Diocese of Syracuse are now required to assist at Holy Mass in person unless you are impaired by health considerations or old age. Our Masses will continue to be live-streamed at 11 AM each Sunday for the benefit of the housebound.

Since we are only allowed 50% of the capacity of the church for Holy Mass, we must still follow our practice of one-half of the alphabet attending every other weekend. (I point out that the 4 PM Saturday Mass and the 11 AM Sunday Mass are the least well-attended. So, if you wish, you may attend either of those Masses on your "off" weekend). You are not sinning by missing Mass every other weekend without the dispensation, since the diocesan restrictions do not permit you to attend Holy Mass!
