THE "MEMORARE" WE SAY AFTER MASS

A few months ago, we began the practice of reciting the "Memorare" prayer to Our Lady after every Mass. We started it to beg Her for a couple of specific intentions: that the Equal Rights Amendment would not be enacted. This constitutional Amendment, would have made abortion a constitutional right, and would thus be much more difficult, if not impossible to overturn. Secondly, we pray the Memorare to implore Our Blessed Mother to prevent the Equality Act from passage. This legislation would have codified the obligation to recognize whatever gender a person claimed to be, rather than their natural God-given sex, and would have placed a burden on Churches to recognize same-sex marriages and even to ordain women. Then, we added the defeat of the "For the People Act", which would have made laws to insure more election fraud. For the time being, it seems as though Our Lady has heard and answered these prayers, undeserving of it as we are.

There is little mention of either of these items currently in our Congress. Not that they will give up trying.

Now, we must add another intention to the invocation of the Mother of God: we must implore Her, Who alone is our refuge and our hope in these evil days, to cleanse our Church of the corruption, the heresy and the evil that has infiltrated her so deeply and devastatingly. It is so difficult to acknowledge this, but the sad truth

is inescapable. I do not want to scandalize you, but you must have an appreciation of the depths of depravity that we have fallen to: Last month, it was revealed that a Msgr. Burrill, who is the secretary to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, a most prestigious and influential position, was using an app on his phone to arrange homosexual hook-ups for himself. The vice-rector of the North American College in Rome, the American seminary, where "the brightest and the best" are sent, was forced to resign due to a lawsuit which has been brought against him for unwanted advances on the seminarians. Now, a Brazilian bishop has been caught on his own cell phone doing lewd things while talking with another man. So, we add this intention to the "Memorare" we pray after Holy Mass, or at home every day. Our hope lies in the great promise of Our Lady at Fatima, "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph."
