IT'S THE MASS THAT MATTERS

We owe Pope Francis a debt of gratitude for his recent Motu Proprio, *Traditionis Custodes*, wherein the Pope decrees that the "Latin Mass" is to be severely restricted in the Church. He says it is not to be celebrated in the parish churches; that priest must now get permission from their Bishops to celebrate it; that no new parishes may be erected for the traditional Mass; and that no religious orders are to be founded that celebrate it. On top of it all, he declares that the Mass of Pope Paul VI, promulgated in 1969, is now the *Lex Orandi* (law of praying) in the Church. In other words, Pope Francis is trying to sweep the Ancient Rite of the Mass, which has been celebrated for 1500 years as the Lex Orandi, into the dustbin of

history, in favor of a new rite (Novus Ordo) that is 52 years old! Why do I say we owe Pope Francis a debt of gratitude? Because this draconian attempt to drown Tradition (which is what the Ancient Rite of the Mass is), will cause it to thrive and flourish and bloom all the more. The Ancient Rite of Mass, or the Mass of the Ages, refuses to die. It is so deeply imbedded in the lifeblood of the Church, that no Pope, no Council, no Bishop has the authority to

declare it "abrogated", abolished. It is our heritage, it is our birthright, it is our Tradition. Young people are waking up to the fact they had been deprived, robbed of their roots!

So even if someone does not prefer the "Latin Mass", this titanic struggle that the Pope has intensified is going to clarify much that has ailed the Church since the II Vatican Council ended in 1965. We all have a huge stake in this contest: Is the Mass essentially the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the Cross renewed on our altar, or is it a communal celebration of the assembly? Are we at Holy Mass to be made to 'feel good about ourselves", or to worship and adore God the most Holy Trinity? Is the Mass directed to God as the Supreme Lord, or toward the community or the individual? Is God worthy of the most beautiful we can offer Him, or is He more pleased with the mundane, the worldly, the trendy?

The Novus Ordo Mass has not produced the good fruits that it should have: declining Mass attendance, a vocation draught, closed Churches and laity who do not know their faith.

The Mass of the Ages is drawing youth and young families and vocations galore! Is this what has the Pope so vehement in his clampdown? It would appear to be so, even as he calls such traditional Catholics as rigid, divisive, and benighted.

The Ancient Rite of the Mass is, in the words of Fr. Frederick Faber, "the most beautiful thing this side of heaven."
