On Vague and Routine Confessions by St. Francis de Sales

Don't be satisfied with vague, general Confessions, made out of mere routine. For example: "I haven't loved God as much as I should. I haven't prayed with as much devotion as I should. I haven't loved my neighbor as I should. I haven't received the Sacraments with sufficient reverence".

Such confessions are altogether useless in enlightening your confessor about the state of your conscience. Nearly all the Saints in heaven, and everyone on earth might confess the same. Instead, examine closely what particular reason you have for accusing yourself of these faults. When you have discovered the reason, accuse yourself simply and plainly of your particular wrongdoing.

For instance, when confessing that you haven't loved your neighbor as you should, perhaps you mean that you saw someone in great need whom you could have helped, yet you neglected to do so. Well, then, specify your neglect. Say that you saw a person in need, and you did not help him as you might have done, either through negligence, or hardness of heart or indifference-whatever the case may be.

As another example: Don't accuse yourself in general of having failed to pray to God with sufficient devotion. If you have yielded your attention to voluntary distractions, or neglected to seek the proper time, place and disposition for prayer, say so plainly, just as it is.

In short, don't deal in useless, lukewarm generalities.

(St Francis de Sales 1567-1622, had been a brilliant student of the law, receiving his doctorate at 24. Despite family opposition, he chose the priesthood. He spent the first five years winning over converts from Calvinism, despite many death threats and mob attacks. He gained thousands of souls back to the Catholic Faith. In 1602, he was named Bishop of Geneva, where his intellect and wisdom shone through. Eventually, with St. Jane de Chantal, he founded the Order of the Visitation. His two most popular works are The Introduction to the Devout Life, and Treatise on the Love of God.)
