NATIONS. BEWARE!

O little flock, says God, be not afraid,
For by Himself your littleness was made.

The Old Testament collection of 150 psalms have, like the rest of the Bible, Almighty God as their primary Author, while the various human beings that He inspired to compose them, notably King David, are merely the Psalms' instrumental author. For the horrors of treach warfare in World War I, Great Britain sent each of its soldiers to war with a copy of the New Testament and the Psalms in their pocket. With it slogan of "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity", it so successfully infected mens minds with godless humanism that in 2023 few modern man can still imagine that turning their backs on God is their huge problem.
