# On the Kingship of Christ

from Credo: A Compendium of the Catholic Faith by Most Rev. Athanasius Schneider

#453. How is Christ a King?

He is the Chief Executor of God's perfect will, the primary Lawgiver and Supreme Judge, omnipotent in executing His own perfect will. "All power is given to Me in heaven and on earth" (Mt. 28:18).

#454. Must the Kingship of Christ be recognized by all men?
Yes, Whether considered as individuals or in the societies of families and nations, "the empire of our Redeemer embraces all men".
#455. How must the Kingship of Christ be acknowledged?

1, Individually by our choice to believe His doctrine and obey His commands;

2. Collectively by families and nations living in accord with the same doctrine;

3. Privately, by progressing in the interior life of holiness;

4. Publicly, by imitating, obeying and adoring our King in all our external actions.

#456. Must be King rule not only over individuals, but also over nations? Yes,in this there is no difference "between the individual and the family or the state; for all men, whether collectively or individually, are under the dominion of Christ. In Him is the salvation of the individual, in Him is the salvation of society."

#457. Does Christ's royal empire extend only to Catholic nations? No, "Christ's empire includes not only Catholic nations, not only baptized persons who, though of right belonging to the Church, have been led astray by error, or have been cut off from her by schism, but also those who are outside the Christian faith; so that truly the whole of mankind is subject to the power of Jesus Christ."

\$458.Are there disastrous consequences if Christ is excluded from political life?

Yes, "With God and Jesus Christ excluded from political life, with authority derived not from God but from man, the very basis of that authority has been taken away....The result is that human society is tottering to its fall, because it no longer has a secure and solid foundation.

#459. What means did the Church establish to realize His reign on earth, until He returns?

The Catholic Church, despite the imperfections of its members, this Church is therefore a divine institution, and already the visible realization of the Kingdom of God on earth.
