# SOME STATISTICS FROM THE ANNUARIO PONTIFICIO

Each year, the Vatican publishes a book of statistics about the state of the Church worldwide. Africa had the largest number of Catholics of any continent in the world. The number of priests dropped by 2,347, but increased in Africa by about 1500. Nigeria had the highest number of Catholics who attend Mass faithfully each week, 97%, while the Netherlands had the lowest percentage at 7%. Worldwide, the number of seminarians dropped by about 2000.
