NYS EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL AT AURIESVILLE SHRINE

The Bishops of New York State have planned a weekend-long program of Eucharist-centered Masses, Adorations, Processions, Talks and Devotions to celebrate the Eucharistic Revival that the USCCB has inaugurated. The weekend runs from October 20-22, Friday evening until Sunday afternoon. You can see the full schedule of these events on the website of the NYS Bishops Eucharistic Revival.

If enough parishioners are interested, we would charter a bus to go on Sat. 21 October for the "main" Mass which would be celebrated at the "Colosseum" Church of the Shrine at 11 AM.

Think about whether you would like to attend this Mass, and we will have a sign-up list up for you to indicate your intention soon.

SOME “POINTS” ON CONFESSION

1. Arrive at the time Confessions are scheduled, not just before they are scheduled to end.
2. Examine your Conscience **before** you enter the Confessional.
3. Please do not sit or stand near the Confessional where you may hear someone going to Confession. Stand in line or sit at least 5 pews from the confessional.
4. Speak distinctly and slowly so the hearing-impaired priest (!!!) can understand you.
5. Name your sins clearly and briefly without rambling.
6. Never confess struggles, or tendencies: No “I could be more patient”, or “I am not as prayerful as I should be.” Who is?
7. Confess only your own sins, not those of your spouse, children or boss.
8. Confess all mortal sins in kind and number. This is necessary for a valid Confession. You may use words like “frequently” or “a few times” rather than a specific number if you do not know it.
9. Confess your most difficult or embarrassing sin first....just get it out.
10. Be specific in naming your sins. No: I had “bad” thoughts. Were they prideful, vain, impure or uncharitable?
11. When you have finished listing your sins, please say “For these and any sin I may have forgotten, I am truly sorry”, so that the priest knows you are finished. He does not want to interrupt you if you are still trying to remember your sins.
12. Listen carefully to the priest's words of advice and the penance he imposes. If you do not understand what he has said, do not hesitate to ask about it.
13. Recite the Act of Contrition aloud, not to yourself.
14. Remember: the priest knows how difficult it is to go to Confession He must go to Confession himself!
