We have been counting the weekend Mass attendance all throughout the year, not just in April and October, as had been done for several years throughout the Diocese.

The most well-attended Mass each weekend is the 8 AM Latin Mass. The least well-attended Masses varies between the 4 PM Saturday Mass and the 11 AM Sunday Mass. Earlier this year, the Bishop directed the priests of our Vicariate (region) to reduce the number of Masses and Confessions so as to be available to cover more parishes due to the acute shortage of priests. Perhaps you have heard that this spring, the city of Rome will be reconfigured, with the closure of St Paul's Church. St Mary's and Transfiguration are already closed there, and in the near future, two priests in Rome will serve St. Peter's, St. John the Baptist as well as St. Joseph's in Lee Center, and St. Ann's in Hinckley. St. Helena's in Sherill will be closed as well, and St. Mary's in Sylvan Beach will only be open during the summer months.

I want to thank you, loyal parishioners, for your continued support of the parish, spiritually and with your participation in our various programs.
